## *Poetry and Poetry in Picture Books* Libby Hathorn

Libby Hathorn is an award winning poet and author of more than fifty books for children and young people, as well as books for adults including *Women's Work; a collection of contemporary Australian Women's Poetry*. Translated into several languages and adapted for stage and screen, her work has won honours in Australia, United States, Great Britain and Holland. She is currently working on a World War I historical novel entitled *Eventual Poppy Day* (HarperCollins to be released in March 2015). She has developed a presentation entitled *An ANZAC in the Family* which explains the process of writing an historical novel based on true war records.

Libby's latest picture books are *A Baby for Loving* and *Outside!* (Hardie Grant Egmont/Little Hare, 2014).

Libby will lead the group through exercises to help 'imagine freshly' and to flesh out the storyboard for a picture book (for younger or older) readers.

### *Bridget McKern and the Kookaburra Anthology Poetry Group*



Each member of the group was asked to select three or four of their favourite poems for the collection which have been shared with the group over this period. The production of this anthology was a simple self-publishing short run with each contributor putting in \$60 to cover costs. Even though they may not have met each other face to face, the reading and critiquing of their poetry over time has bound the ladies together and given them a special relationship of shared words and emotions.

Bridget, together with Anne, Jennifer and Toni Brisland are looking forward to presenting some of the poems at the luncheon. Copies will be available for purchase on the day.



## Guest Speaker *Mistress to the Crown* Isolde Martyn

Isolde returns to the NSW Society of Women Writers in October to talk about the writing of her recent novel *Mistress to the Crown*. It's about Elizabeth Lambard, King Edward IV's lover, known in history as Mistress 'Jane' Shore.

She enjoys using turbulent historical events as the backdrop of her stories. In 2000, her debut novel, *The Maiden and the Unicorn*, was the first novel by an Australian to win the prestigious Rita award for 'Best First Novel' from Romance Writers of America and her first two books have won the mainstream 'Romantic Book of the Year Award' in Australia.

She has a history honours degree from Exeter University, has worked in academia and was a senior book editor with Readers Digest General Books. Sharing history has always been her passion and she is a former Chair of the Sydney Richard III Society and co-founder and Vice-chair of the Plantagenet Society of Australia.
