Anna Cater

Anna began her career as a print journalist and has written for newspapers and magazines around the world, as well as working for the ABC's *Background Briefing* and *Four Corners* programs. After graduating with an MA in Documentary at AFTRS in 1997, she established her production company Mitra Films, producing many documentaries for Australian and international broadcasters.

Her credits include the award-winning films *Dick Smith's Population Puzzle* (ABC) – the highest rating documentary on the ABC in 2010; *Frank Hurley – the Man Who Made History* (BBC, ABC) – recently selected as a prescribed text for HSC English; *Outsourced!* (PBS, SBS); and *Honeybee Blues* (SBS, Nat Geo). She has worked for Oxfam in the UK and Australia and ACOSS, and has recently produced the feature film *Rites of Passage*.

Women in the Kingdom of Ink

Dr Jeannine Baker

Women journalists were granted equal pay for equal work in 1917 – several decades before the 1970s federal equal pay cases. But until the 1960s most women journalists were confined to lower status work on the women's pages of daily newspapers with limited opportunities for advancement. Historian Jeannine Baker introduces us to the talented and fascinating women who wrote for the women's pages – and beyond – in the 'Kingdom of Ink'.

Historian Dr Jeannine Baker is a postdoctoral research fellow at the Department of Media, Music, Communication and Cultural Studies at Macquarie University. She has produced documentaries for ABC Radio National, and wrote and directed the television documentary *Our Drowned Town*. She has been awarded the Dennis-Wettenhall Prize for her doctoral thesis, 'Beyond the "Woman's Angle": Australian Women War Reporters During World War II'.

Annabel Crabb is the Chief Online Political Writer at the Australian Broadcasting Corporation and writes about politics for *The Drum*.

She has worked extensively in print journalism including in Adelaide for *The Advertiser*, in Melbourne for *The Age* and in Sydney for *The Sydney Morning Herald*. She has also hosted the popular television show *Kitchen Cabinet*.

Annabel has won two Logie Awards and a Walkley Award in 2009 for her Quarterly Essay *Stop at Nothing: The Life and Adventures of Malcolm Turnbull*. Her books include *Losing it: The Inside Story of the Labor Party in Opposition* (2005), *Rise of the Ruddbot: Observations from the Gallery* (2010) and *The Wife Drought* (2014).

Abbie Clancy Award

Abigail Mary Clancy (1898-1984), the first woman reporter regularly assigned to the NSW Legislative Assembly Press Gallery from 1923 to 1930 was one of the founders of SWW. The Award is in honour of her contributions to Australian women's writing. Valued at \$1000 it is made annually to a female Honours or Research Higher Degree student in an Australian literature, history, communications or creative writing course in a NSW university.

Congratulations to SWW member Libby Hathorn who has been awarded the 2014 Alice Award.

The Alice is awarded to an Australian woman who by her written work has made a distinguished and long-term contribution to Australian literature.

Former winners include a host of wonderful writers including Judith Wright, Elizabeth Jolley, Ruth Park, Kylie Tennant, Eleanor Dark, Dame Mary Durack, Rosemary Dobson and more recently Brenda Niall, Mem Fox and Kate Grenville.

In her acceptance speech Libby talked of early influences on her writing especially relatives who read poetry out loud and summed up in this way: "Accepting with humility and gratitude this incredible honour of the Alice Award, which allows me to move into the finest of the fine writerly company, I thank you for valuing what I offer which of course, as with any writer, seems never enough. With or without you, I will go on with my writing as I have since childhood, however, I want to say this. Allowing me this award for the body of my work is one of the greatest compliments a writer can have- to know that someone is hearing you and is reading your heart."
