Crafting Short Fiction That Sells Cat Sparks

A good short story is transformative. A snapshot of the human condition, its concise suggestiveness engenders passion and can linger with you long after you have stopped reading.

Crafting short stories is a specific skill that focuses issues of language and structure, and it can assist with understanding problems common to all writing.

This workshop aims to examine the elements required in creating a publishable short story, from opening hook through to closing sentence. We will examine story vs plot; inspiration; story structure; believable characters; strong beginnings, middle and ends; point-of-view; setting; conflict, and theme; tips on making every sentence count; paying markets; critique groups; how much revision is too much; cover letters and submission etiquette; rejection and how to deal with it.

Cat Sparks is a multi-award winning writer and Fiction Editor of Cosmos Magazine, with over 65 short stories published and a PhD in the works.



Writing the Real Alana Valentine

Playwright Alana Valentine will discuss the unique combination of oral history and drama that is verbatim theatre. She'll share her recent adventures in the archives of the National Library and the Royal Archives at Windsor Castle, and how being underestimated, patronised and ignored can be harnessed by the clever woman writer.

In 2014 Alana Valentine worked as dramaturg on Stephen Page and Bangarra's *Patyegarang*, won an AWGIE Award for Community/Youth Theatre writing for *Comin' Home Soon* and won the BBC International Radio Writing Competition (1000 entries from 86 countries) for *The Ravens*. In 2015, *Head Full of Love*, directed by Wesley Enoch, will tour nationally and *Barefoot Divas* will play the Hong Kong International Festival. Her plays *Parramatta Girls* and *Shafana* and *Aunt Sarrinah* are both on the NSW Schools Syllabus and in 2013 she was awarded the Major AWGIE and the inaugural David Williamson Award for Theatre Excellence for her play *Grounded*.



Writing Across Mediums and the World: The Story of the *I Am Jack* Books

Susanne Gervay

Awarded an Order of Australia, Susanne Gervay is recognised for her writing on social justice. An award winning short story writer, she is widely published in literary journals and anthologies including the Indian-Australian Fear Factor, Terror Incognito alongside Sir Salman Rushdie and Thomas Kenelly. Her books are translated into many languages and include her young adult Butterflies recognized as Outstanding Youth Literature on Disability and rite-of-passage anti-bullying *I Am Jack* books which have been adapted into a play touring Australia and the USA. Susanne's picture books address disability, inclusion and multiculturalism, while *Elephants Have Wings*, which engages with peace, is in development as an animation.

An acclaimed international speaker, Susanne heads SCBWI (ANZ), is Writer Ambassador for Room to Read and Books in Home, Patron - Monkey Baa Theatre, former Chair of the NSW Writers Centre and an Australia Day Ambassador.

Valerie Parv is the voice behind many of Australia's most guilty pleasures. Tales of flights of fantasy, daddies with deadlines and naughty nannies have had many a commuter hiding behind paperbacks for more than 30 years.



