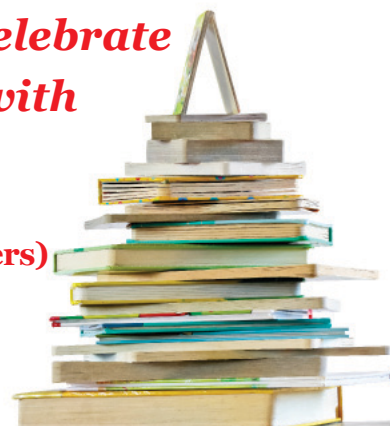

Writing about the Past: Dos and Don'ts

Dr Maria Hill



Dr Maria Hill is a professional historian with a Honours, Masters and PhD in History. She has written award-winning history books and teaching kits for schools.

Her first book for the general public: *Diggers and Greeks, exploring the relationship forged between Australian soldiers and Greek people during World War Two* was short listed for the Queensland Premier's Prize in History in 2010.

In this workshop Maria will share the methods historians use when writing about the past to help authors of historical fiction and non-fiction.

She will offer some guidelines on what you do and don't do when writing true stories or fictional accounts based on a true story and discuss the ethics of blurring the boundary between fact and fiction.

Congratulations Isobelle Barrett Meyering the 2015 recipient of the Abbie Clancy Award

Isobelle's work is titled *Feminism for Girls: Joyce Nicholson's What Society Does to Girls* (1975).

She will be presented her award by Emeritus Professor Elizabeth Webby at the SWW December luncheon.

Isobelle Barrett Meyering is a PhD candidate in the School of Humanities and Languages at UNSW. She is in the final stages of completing her doctoral thesis, which examines the position of children in the Australian feminist movement (1969-1979). Isobelle graduated with a Bachelor of Arts (First Class Honours) from the University of Sydney in 2009. Her work has been published in *History Australia*, *Lilith* and *Outskirts*, and she is a founding member of the editorial collective for *History in the Making*, a national online journal for history students.

In addition to her studies, Isobelle was a Postgraduate Teaching Fellow at UNSW from 2014 to 2015, and worked as a research assistant at the Australian Domestic and Family Violence Clearinghouse from April 2009 to December 2013.
