The Power of Dialogue

SUSANNE GERVAY OAM

'Think like a wise man but communicate in the language of the people.' - William Butler Yeats

Dialogue is a core way to write story that resonates with the reader. It is a way to create voice, character, advance story, hold emotional content. It contains the spirit of the story. While it shadows daily dialogue, it has a greater purpose than mimicking every day speech. In this hands-on workshop, we explore the power of dialogue to communicate story.

You'll find Susanne planting 3000 mangroves in Kiribati; in Istanbul sharing her I Am Jack books and NO Bullying; in remote indigenous communities sharing story with elders and children; invited to speak at World Burn Conference in New York on her novel Butterflies; in Goa at the Indian Association for the Study of Australia Conference about the Indian-Australian anthologies which feature her short stories along with David Malouf and Sir Salman Rushdie. Awarded the Lifetime Social Justice Literature Award by the International Literacy Association, a nominee for the Astrid Lindgren Memorial Award with an Order of Australia, Susanne Gervay is recognised for her award winning short stories and youth literature. www.sgervay.com




Member Speaker

I was born and brought up in apartheid South Africa. I studied medicine in India and worked at a hospital in Durban. I finally settled in Sydney where I had a solo G.P. practice. My grandchildren's curiosity and questions led me to put pen to paper. 'One Woman's Journey' is the story of a woman's resilience and ability to adapt to varied situations in different countries. Childhood in one country is followed by family life in another. The final destination is the 'lucky' country.

Mentoring for writing and editing

Carolyn Beaumont

A mentor is a supporter of writers but never a dictator.

With quiet encouragement and gentle suggestion, a mentor can assist a writer to complete a poem, short story, novel, play, family history or biography.

A mentor can assist with mental blocks. There are solutions.

A mentor can discuss characters, dialogues, plots, settings and themes.

A mentor can be a sounding wall for a writer to bounce off ideas, sentence structures, chapter sequences, legal and ethical issues.

The corporate or self-publishing processes require manuscripts to be thoroughly edited and then proofread at printing stage.

A mentor can offer an objective view of structural balance and a fresh eye on line (or copy) editing of the text.

A mentor can advise on communications between authors and publishers/printers and discuss changes that may be advised.

A mentor can guide an author through the proofreading stage to final publication.

An effective mentor knows that the final decision must always be the author's decision.

Working with an author or editor on **Substantive/Structural Editing**.

Clarifying or reorganising a manuscript for content and structure. Does **not** include the following:

- research
- writing original material.
